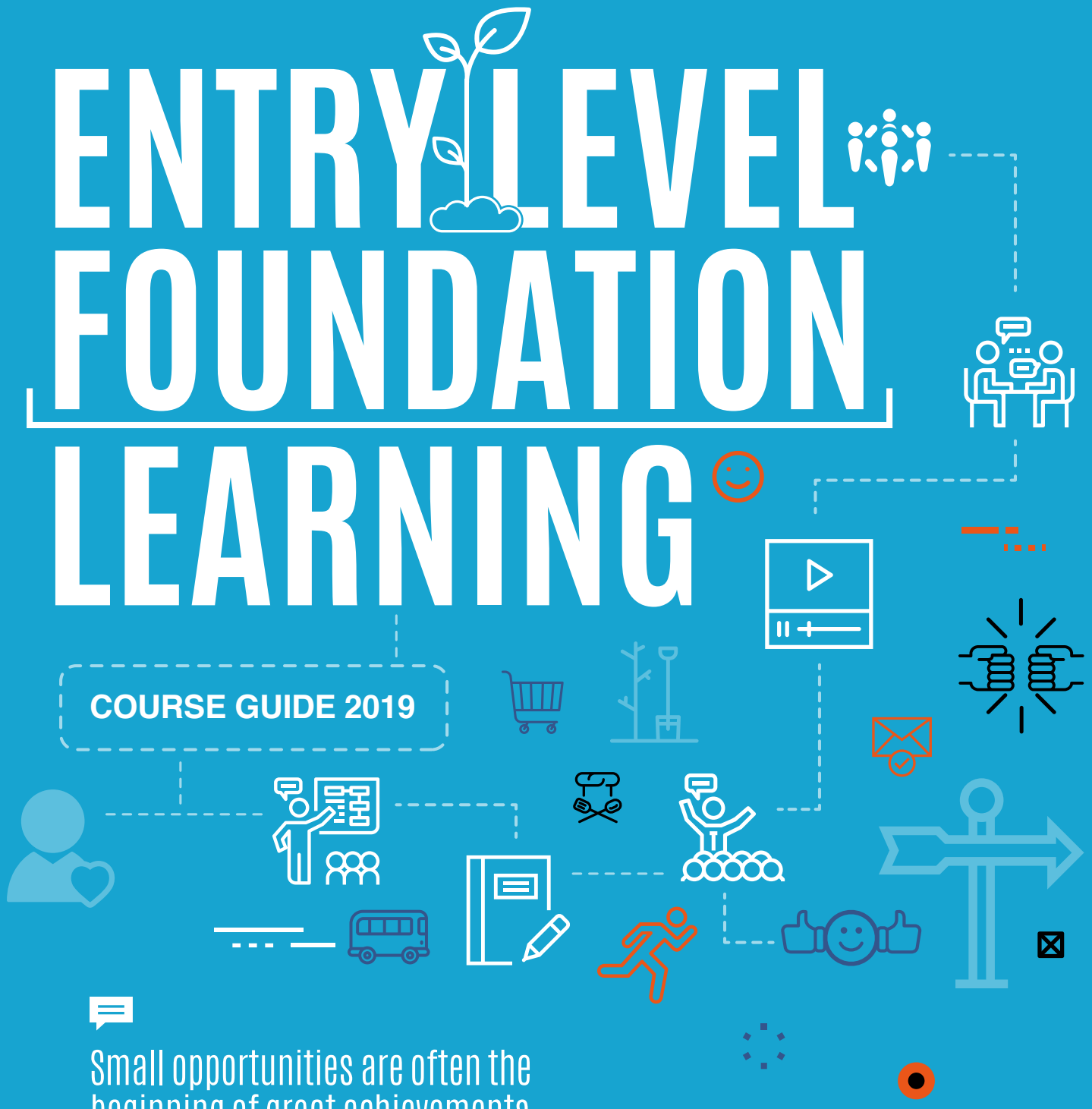


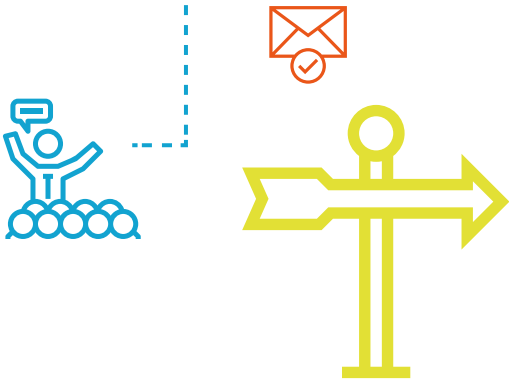

My favourite lesson is Enrichment. I enjoy any creative activity, especially drawing. I took part in Art Therapy, I had to paint my feelings to music which was lovely.

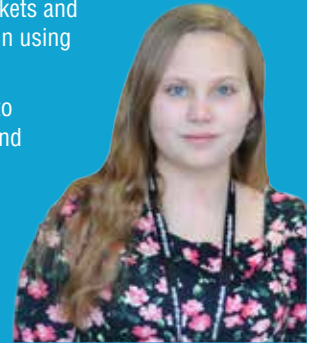

- Functional Skills Maths and English



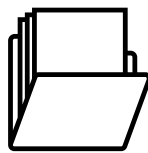

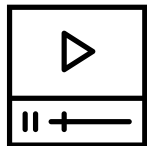

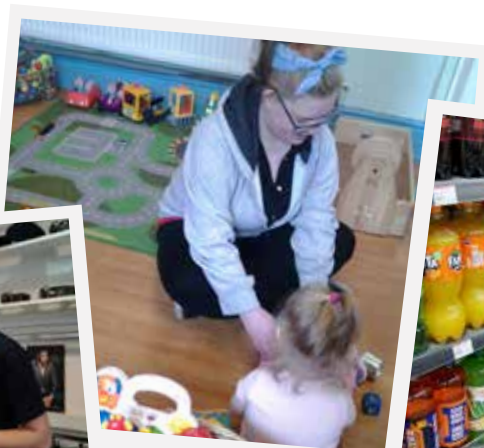
How do I apply?
