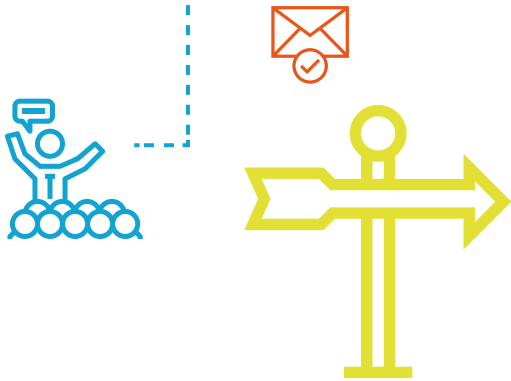

OUR STUDENTS SAY...

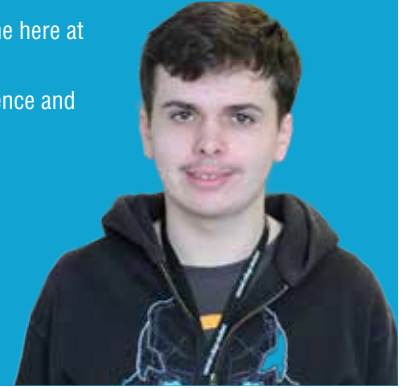
I like the staff at Carmel, they are very friendly. I can ask for support at any time and get on well with my work.

- Functional Skills Maths and English



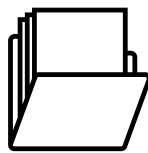

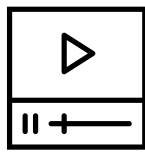
