

Law Frequently Asked Questions

The majority of FAQs are answered in the course leaflet but here is some extra information -

What text books do I need?

We use AQA A Level Law Books 1 and 2 by Jaqueline Martin and Nicholas Price.



There is no need to buy these as we have copies in the classroom and they are available in the college library too. In addition, we have revision guides and detailed handouts for each topic.

What will I study?

As no one now studies Law at GCSE Level, we will start with the basics. You will learn about how the courts work, who is involved in the legal system and how law is made and used.

You will learn about Criminal Law including assaults such as GBH and wounding. We cover murder and manslaughter and property offences such theft and robbery. We go onto look at how you can sue someone if they cause harm to you by a negligent act or interfere with your enjoyment of your property by being a nuisance. Our last main area of study is about contractual law. We look at how contracts are made and what you can do if someone breaks their contractual obligations to you.

How will I be examined?

There is no coursework on this course. All of the exams are at the end of the two-year course. There are three exams that are two hours in length and cover the main topics of Criminal Law, Tort Law (suing someone) and Contract Law.

Minimum Entry Requirements

You will need a minimum of five grade five GCSEs with at least a grade five in English Language.
