1. Is there a written exam for 3D Design?

There is no written exam for 3D Design the exam is practical and follows the same assessment criteria as coursework.

You do not have to have studied Art or DT at GCSE. Some students come onto the course with no experience since their option year courses and they complete the course with excellent results.
