# PROVIDING SUPPORT STEP OF THE WAY

At Carmel we are extremely proud of the care and support given to all our students. Your young person will be supported by our dedicated academic and pastoral teams to enable them to reach their potential and progress successfully.

# PERSONAL ACHIEVEMENT TUTORS

Your young person will be assigned a Personal Achievement Tutor (PAT) who, from their first day at college, will look after their wellbeing as well as monitoring their academic progress.

## Personal Achievement Tutors provide:

- progress monitoring to make sure students are on track with their studies
- · help with study skills
- help with applications for university, apprenticeships and employment
- help with Personal Statement writing
- referrals for any extra help or support they may need

# 10:10 ETHICS AND VALUES PROGRAMME

As a Catholic College, we have a great focus on nurturing the whole person, allowing our students to develop personally as well as academically. Our 10:10 Ethics and Values Programme takes inspiration from the teaching of John 10:10 'I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full'.

Your young person will attend one 10:10 Ethics and Values lesson per week. These sessions are exam and homework free, focusing on topics such as progression, health and lifestyle, study support and skills development as well as ethical issues, moral debates, and current events.

# FINANCIAL MATTERS



### **BURSARY SUPPORT**

At Carmel College we offer a number of bursaries to full-time students who meet the criteria for financial support.

**The General Bursary** is available to full-time students who meet the necessary criteria.

If your annual household income is £31,500 or below, you may be entitled to financial support of up to £1,050 per year.\*

The Targeted Bursary offers financial assistance for students who are in care, are care leavers, are in receipt of Income Support/ Universal Credits or disabled and in receipt of Employment and Support Allowance/Universal Credits and Disability Living Allowance/Personal Independence Payments.

**Transport Bursary** – if you live outside a 2-mile radius of college, we will contribute towards transport costs for eligible students who qualify for the General Bursary.

\*Bursary awards remain subject to availability of funds and the number of eligible applicants. More information can be found on our website.

# STUDENT TRANSPORT

# Travelling to Carmel couldn't be easier, even if you don't live on our doorstep.

The college is on main public bus routes from the Knowsley, St Helens, Liverpool, Golborne and Leigh areas.

As well as paid services, there are also a number of **FREE** bus options for students depending on where you live. These include:

- A free Merseytravel bus pass if you reside in St Helens and live more than 2 miles away from college
- · A free contracted bus service from Widnes
- · A free contracted bus service from Westbrook, Warrington

## **PARKING**

We have student parking on West Park Rugby Club, next door to the college. This is **FREE** for Carmel students. There are also areas for moped and bicycle parking on campus.

# KEEPING YOU INFORMED

The transition from school to college is just the start of a new and exciting journey in your young person's education. During their time at college they will gain confidence and independence, but we know it is still important to keep parents informed.

# ATTENDANCE AND ABSENCE PROCEDURE

We have high standards at Carmel and expect all students to have at least 97% attendance. Your young person's Personal Achievement Tutor will contact you if attendance falls below this target.

Parents/carers must notify the college of any student absences by telephoning 01744 452220 or emailing info@carmel.ac.uk. We do not permit students to self-certify their own absence. You will also receive a text message to notify you of any absences.

Some absences can be authorised, such as hospital, orthodontist appointments and funerals. Other medical appointments should be arranged outside of their class time.



# **PARENT LOGIN**

Parent Login allows you to access information such as attendance, timetable, student notes, student subject reviews and exam information. You will log in using your young person's college reference number and personal details on the CEDAR App.

# **PARENTMAIL**

Central college emails are sent to parents/carers via ParentMail. Once your young person is enrolled, you will receive an instruction email to set up your account.

ParentMail is also our online payment service that can be used to pay for trips, visits, exam resits and stationery. In addition, you can add payments to your young person's account to allow them to purchase refreshments from our restaurant and coffee bar using their college ID badge.

# **PROGRESS REVIEWS**

Parent consultation evenings take place once a year in Spring for Lower Sixth students and twice a year in Autumn and Spring for Upper Sixth students. These are online via School Cloud and will be an opportunity for you to discuss your young person's progress with subject tutors.

## **CAREERS GUIDANCE**

Carmel students have access to expert careers advice and guidance from our experienced careers team who can help your young person make an informed choice about their future.

# The team provides:

- · Personalised information and support
- · Resources and activities to develop skills for the future
- Help with university and course choices, apprenticeships and employment
- · An annual careers fair
- · Talks from visiting speakers from universities and industry
- · University Open Day visits

The college also subscribes to Unifrog, an online destinations platform. It provides a one-stop-shop for finding and comparing opportunities at universities (both in the UK and abroad) as well as for apprenticeships and much more! Not only will students have their own login for Unifrog, but parents can have a login too enabling you to browse all the opportunities available and help your young person find the best options for their future.

## **WORK EXPERIENCE**

We encourage our students to participate in work experience or volunteering as it's a great way to build confidence and key employability skills. Our experienced Work Experience Co-ordinator is available in our careers hub to provide personalised support and guidance.





# This Programme will support, challenge and inspire your young person to be the best they can be academically, helping them to succeed beyond Carmel.

To be invited to participate in the HA+ Programme, your young person will need an average GCSE points score of 7 or above, or be identified by their subject teachers as Gifted or Talented.

Support and challenge are at the heart of this Programme that is delivered by the Academic Team, the Pastoral Team and supported by the HA+ Co-ordinators. Every student on the Programme is also part of a High Achievers+ tutor group.
