A Level Biology

Learn about a wide variety of fundamental biological principles from cellular biology, biochemistry and genetics, to big concepts, including energy transfers through ecosystems, nervous communication and other systems in our bodies.

This course involves:

Year 1:

- Biological molecules
- Cells, including structures, functions and processes
- Mammalian transport, exchange and digestion
- Natural selection and impact

Year 2:

- Nervous communication and muscles
- Homeostatic control of blood glucose and water potential
- Energy systems (photosynthesis and respiration)
- Inheritance of genetics
- Modern DNA technologies - their applications in modern scientific research are emphasised

A Level Chemistry

Chemistry underpins every aspect of modern life, from the development of life-saving medicines to the materials used in cutting-edge technology. Its importance to the way we live our modern lives cannot be overstated. By studying Chemistry, you will develop a deeper understanding of the world around you and the science behind real-world applications.

Our dedicated tutors will support you in achieving your full potential and the highest grade possible.

This course involves:

- Inorganic and Physical Chemistry: Calculating the pH of solutions and understanding how storage and fuel cells work

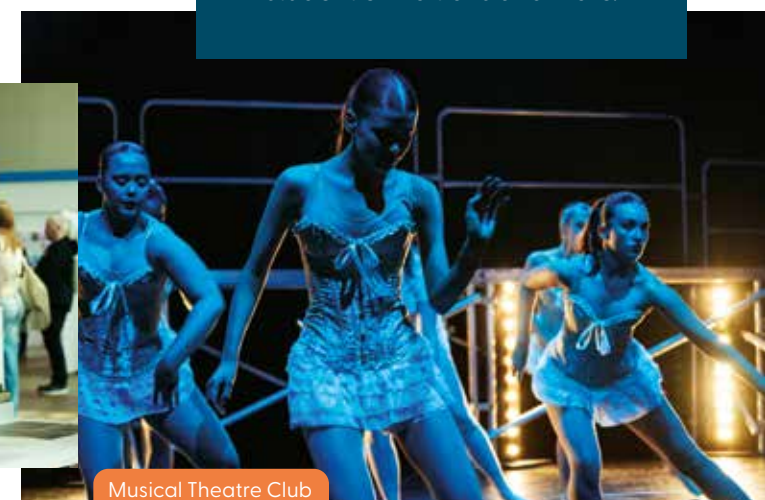

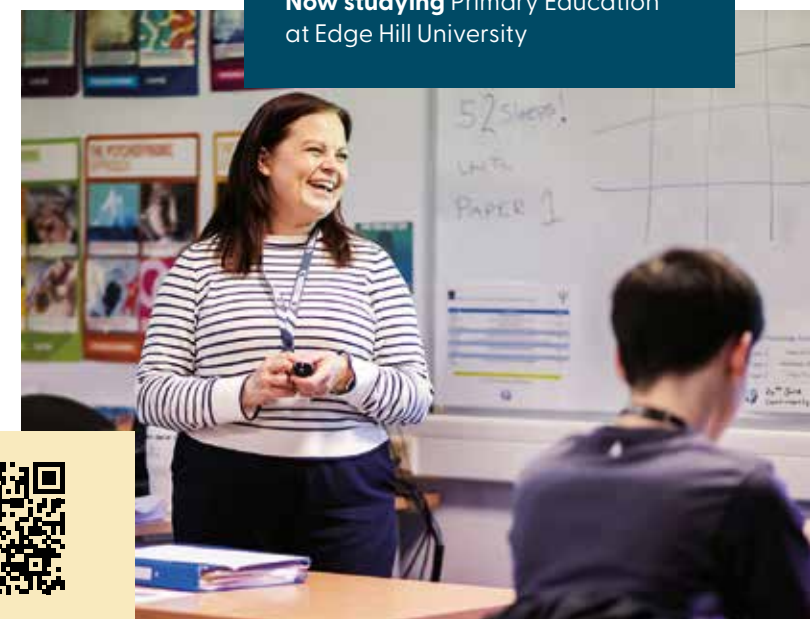

A Level Physical Education

Develop knowledge of scientific, socio-cultural and practical aspects of PE. You will develop an understanding of the physiological/psychological states that affect performance and take part in practical workshops, gaining insights from industry experts.

This course involves:

- Physiology: Anatomy and physiology, exercise physiology, and biomechanics
- Sports Psychology: How performers learn skills in sport / mental preparation for sport
- Socio-cultural Studies: Historical studies, ethics and values in sport, contemporary sporting issues
- Performance: Practical assessment of your skills as a performer or coach in one sport from the specification. Regular involvement in competitive sport is required to study A Level PE
- Evaluation and Analysis for Performance: Verbal assessment
